









Common Area Planning Committee (CAPC) is currently surveying all Greenfield residents as to the recreational activities they participate in (and are possibly in future interested in) as well as what activities they would like to see offered that are not now available. This is part of a study being done to report to the Board as to what our present and future recreational and common area needs might be. The Report will be part of the Board's continuing effort to keep Greenfield offering the best possible recreation activities to its residents and ensuring the common area generally is serving residents as well as possible. Response to the survey invitation sent out December 11th has been brisk but it is important that the committee hear from as many residents as possible. The report may well lead to future developments in the resort and since those developments may affect all of us (whether as a user or an owner paying for it), it is imperative that as many as possible have input into the data forming the basis for the recommendations in the report. WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!

Participation in the Survey can be accomplished two ways:

1. Online by utilizing Survey Monkey, the program CAPC is using to conduct the survey. Respondents anonymously answer 11 questions on their computer and the program stores the answers and allows us to analyze the overall results. To participate online go to Greenfield website www.greenfieldvillage.com. When Home page comes up click on Survey Entrance at top of page. When prompted enter password: green and when survey comes up answer questions and click on submit 2. Complete paper copy of survey questions by marking answers in pen and dropping it off at, faxing it to 480-832-7749 or mailing to office to offer.

85206. Copies of survey questions were sent to most residents December 11 or are available for pickup at the office and will be handed out to tenants as they check

It is of tremendous help to the committee if you use the online option. Paper responses have to be entered into the Survey Monkey software by a committee member since that information is required to ensure the analysis of the answers by using the program reflects all responses.

CAPC is also, as part of this study, meeting with recreation facility user groups to ascertain their needs, level of participation in their activity etc. Using the contact information the Activities Office has as to each user group, the committee will contact the spokesperson shown on that record to set up a meeting with the user group. It is important that the information the Activities Office has as to the contact person is current but if not, it is incumbent on the person erroneously receiving that letter to pass it on to whoever is now the contact.
